Margaret Soulier Homan



One afternoon after a meeting of our Worker's Union group at the Arcade United Church of Christ, Congregational, Margaret and I were talking about family history and how much she enjoyed Henry Louis Gates television show, Finding Your Roots on PBS. Since I had an Ancestry account and enjoyed genealogy, I invited Margaret to come to my home weekly for a number of months to do some research about the Grevemberg Family and others.

As we worked, Margaret would sometimes bring photographs and share stories about her sisters and how after her parents had died, it was her Grandmere who cared for the girls. She was very close to her grandmother, Annette Grevemberg.

As a girl, Margaret took ballet lessons and eventually taught ballet. It was through this work that Margaret met her husband and came to Western New York. As a young soldier, Hal Homan, was stationed in Louisiana and had the good fortune of being the driver of the jeep that was sent to transport Margaret and her girls to perform for the USO Club. Margaret and Hal started to date and on February 10, 1946 they were married at 3 pm in St. Francis Xavier Roman Catholic Church in Alexandira, Rapides Parish, LA. Margaret reported that this was one of the first marriages allowed in her church with the bride and groom of different religions. Hal was Protestant and Margaret Roman Catholic.

Before coming to Arcade, NY (a village about 35 miles south of Buffalo, NY) Margaret and Hal lived in Rochester, NY and in East Aurora, NY where Hal worked for Fisher Price Toy Co. In about 1980, they relocated to the

Arcade area and became very involved with the Arcade United Church of Christ, Congregational. They were both very hospitable and often held Bible study groups, as well as fellowship and women's group meetings in their home. They were a wonderful addition to any group. Margaret worked with a group of quilters to make a quilt each year that was raffled to raise scholarship money for young people in our church. She was also very involved with the Mary Hosford Fisher Women's group as well as the mission group and Worker's Union. She took a leadership role even in ecumenical groups like the Pioneer Area Council of Churches. Still, at 98 years old, she took a very active part in the finances of the church, mission projects and ministry.

Margaret was proud of her Louisiana roots and noted for her lemon squares, candied grapefruit peel and pecan pie, as well as other Southern treats. She was like the matriarch of our church and is dearly missed.



BUILDING AND GROUNDS MINUTES MAY 25, 2025

In attendance: Bruce Dennis, Dona Roll, Kathy May, Ginger Comstock, Randy Lutz

Basement Windows: Randy indicated he has not heard from Jim McGarvey regarding scheduling the window replacement. Windows have been ordered.

Ceiling Tiles for Wetzel Hall: Randy received a bid of \$3,400 from Sixt Lumber but that price is likely to come down. This could possibly be funded through Endowment.

Roof Repair: Ginger indicated that the Historical Society will be painting the Gibby House and will be needing a lift to perform that task. (Since we first discussed this, the painter has purchased a lift) Is it possible to work with them on the lift rental? Can we schedule painting the louvres and roof repair around this? Ginger will check with Jeff Mason on the possibility of working with the Historical Society on this.

Outside Spring Clean-Up: Kathy will be taking care of outside spring clean-up when weather permits.

Carpet Cleaning: Kathy received an estimate from Ashford Carpet Cleaning (copy attached). Tim from Ashford indicated the cleaning can be split up to be more cost friendly to the church. At this point cleaning the carpets in the annex is needed more immediately. Ashford does not clean hard surfaces so we will need to find someone else to clean the kitchen floor. Dona will check with Vanessa's husband, John, to see if he would be interested in doing this.

Fixtures for small sink in kitchen: Bruce will gather pricing on a fixture and any other parts that are

needed to replace the fixture. When Bruce looked at it earlier, he indicated it may need a bit more work than just replacing the fixture itself.

Replacing refrigerator in the Great Room:

Refrigerator will be replaced at some point over the summer (before Fall Festival in October).

Boiler Room water issues: Randy will patch the hole where the ethernet cable comes into the boiler room which was one source of the leaking problems we had last winter.

Fire Inspection: Kathy will contact Wyoming County regarding our annual fire inspection. At this time, she will address the alarm in the ladies' room in the annex with the inspector.
